Child Find Program

Locating, Evaluating and Identifying Children with Disabilities

Child Find is a public awareness activity to locate, evaluate, and identify children ages 3 through 21 years of age who may have disabilities defined under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) of 2004. A child with a disability means a child evaluated and determined eligible for special education and related services in accordance with the Policies and Procedures of Special Education in Oklahoma.

Stanley Hupfeld Academy is responsible for locating, evaluating and identifying children with disabilities who live within the district boundaries. All eligible children with disabilities beginning at the age of three, who are residents of the Stanley Hupfeld Academy District attendance zone, have a right to a Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) as mandated by the IDEA Act of 2004. The specific special education related services for children ages 3-21 are determined per child by the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team.

For individuals who are residents of the Stanley Hupfeld Academy District attendance zone or attend a private school in our attendance zone and need information regarding an evaluation to determine eligibility for services, please contact:

A multidisciplinary team of professionals will be involved in the evaluation process. The eligibility team will determine the severity of the disability, and for school age children, if the disability adversely affects the child's educational performance.
